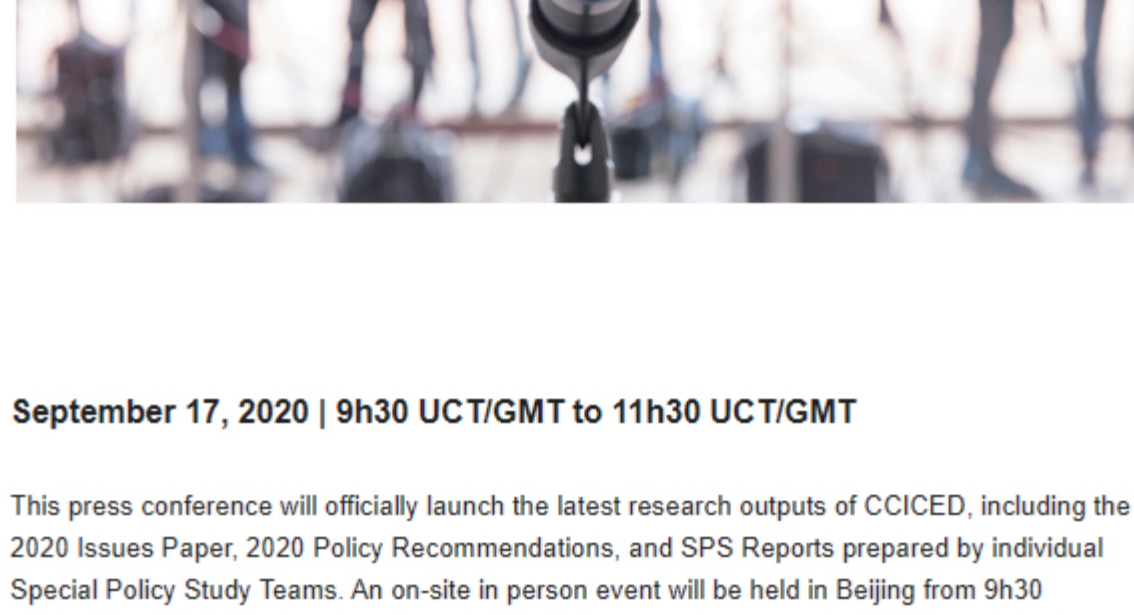




Upcoming Event

We Can't Fight Climate Change Without China

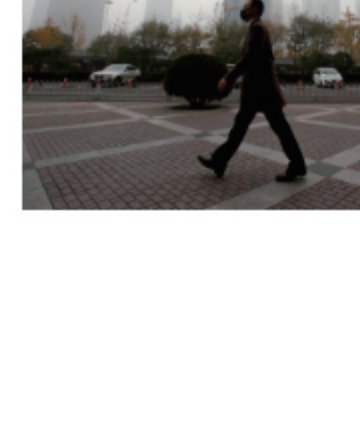

China's economy firms against twin shocks of floods, epidemic

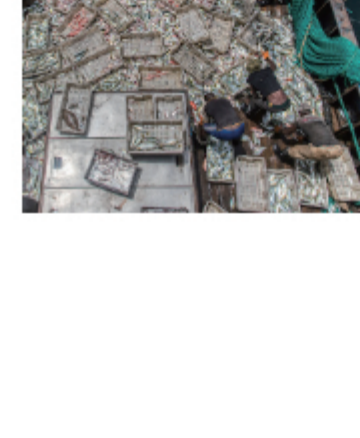

After 500 Years Trying to Tame Fatal Floods, China Tries a New Way

Aug 13, Bloomberg News - China's National Climate Center has records of natural disasters going back 500 years, and in almost every one of them there was a major flood. The "sponge city" initiative, launched in 2015, is an attempt to reverse that — soak up heavy precipitation and release it slowly into the rivers and reservoirs. Using features such as rooftop gardens, scenic wetland parks, permeable pavements and underground storage tanks, the plan is to eventually absorb or reuse 70% of the rainwater that falls on four-fifths of China's urban land. 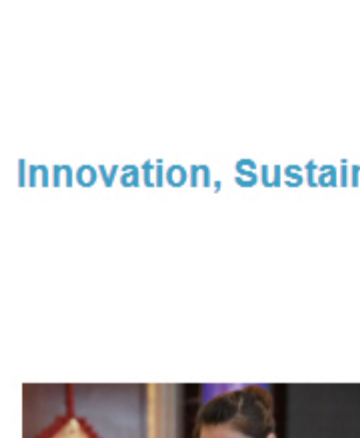
China air pollution falls 10.8% because of coronavirus slowdown

Aug 14, Reuters - China saw average concentrations of lung-damaging airborne particles known as PM2.5 fall by 10.8% from January to July as industry slowed because of the coronavirus, though levels were still well above WHO recommendations. Average PM2.5 stood at 33 micrograms per cubic metre over the seven months, according to data collected from monitoring stations in more than 300 cities, the Ministry of Ecology and Environment said. 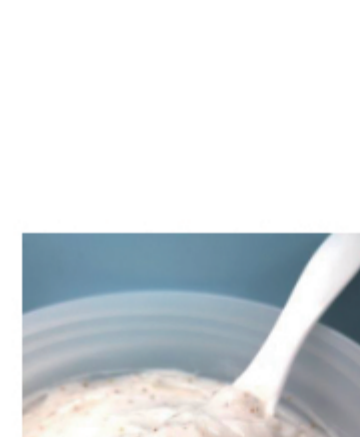
China issues new sustainability rules for its notorious fishing fleet

The new rules aim to curb illegal activity, increase transparency and improve sustainability in commercial fishing. They will take effect between January 2020 and January 2021.
